CISA Known Exploited Vulnerabilities

In 2020 there were over 17,000 vulnerabilities identified. In 2021 there were over 18,000 vulnerabilities identified. National Vulnerability Database includes more than 160,000 Less than 4% of CVEs have been publicly exploited

Binding Operational Directive (BOD) 22-01: Reducing the Significant Risk of Known Exploited Vulnerabilities.

Directive establishes a CISA managed catalog of known exploited vulnerabilities and requires federal civilian agencies to identify and remediate these vulnerabilities

To be added to catalog – there is a CISA executive level review, and that the vulnerability meets the 3 requirements:

- 1. The vulnerability has an assigned Common Vulnerabilities and Exposures (CVE) ID.
- 2. There is reliable evidence that the vulnerability has been actively exploited in the wild.
- 3. There is a clear remediation action for the vulnerability, such as a vendor provided update.

CISA strongly recommends review and monitor the catalog and <u>remediate</u> the listed vulnerabilities
